CASA ALONSO | A DAY IN HAVANA

When the nearly 90-year-old Cuban woman Josie Alonso opened the door for him, a photographer's dream came true for Daniel Ricardo González. Accompanied by the villa's resident, he was now able to immerse himself in a myth. In 1929, Óscar Alonso – then Vice President of the Camagüey Railways – had this villa built in what is now the legendary colonial style of Havana. Since then, it has remained in the family's possession.

With the eye of his camera, the photographer from Ravensburg plunged into the magic of this architecture in the spring of 2018. During the hours spent in the “Casa Alonso,” photographs of captivating beauty were created. The photo series Casa Alonso is a homage to the transience of beauty and to the charm of the morbid. As we contemplate the photographs of Casa Alonso, we virtually stroll through the house, seduced by its colors, details, and sightlines – and it almost feels as though we could even sense the aromas.

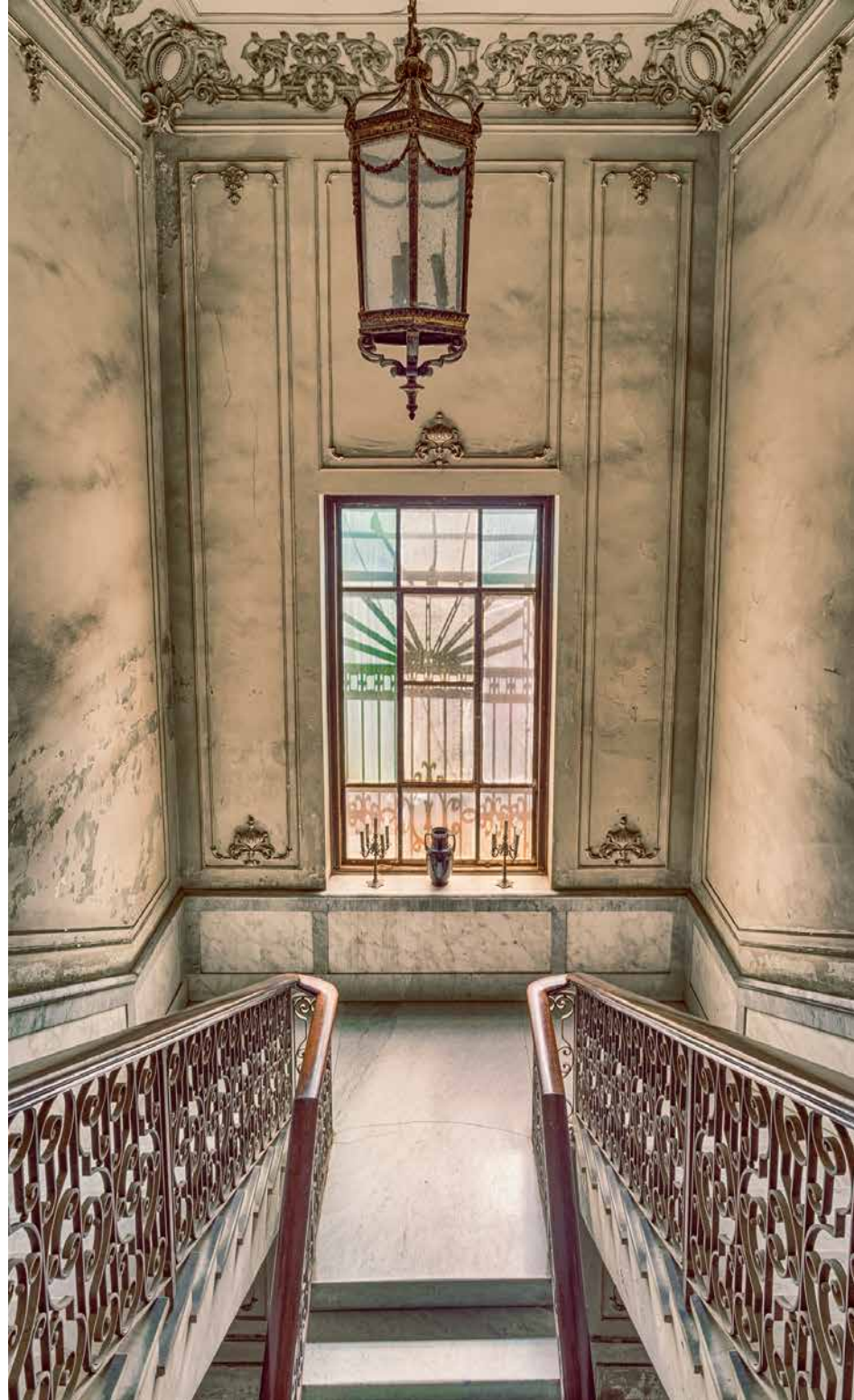

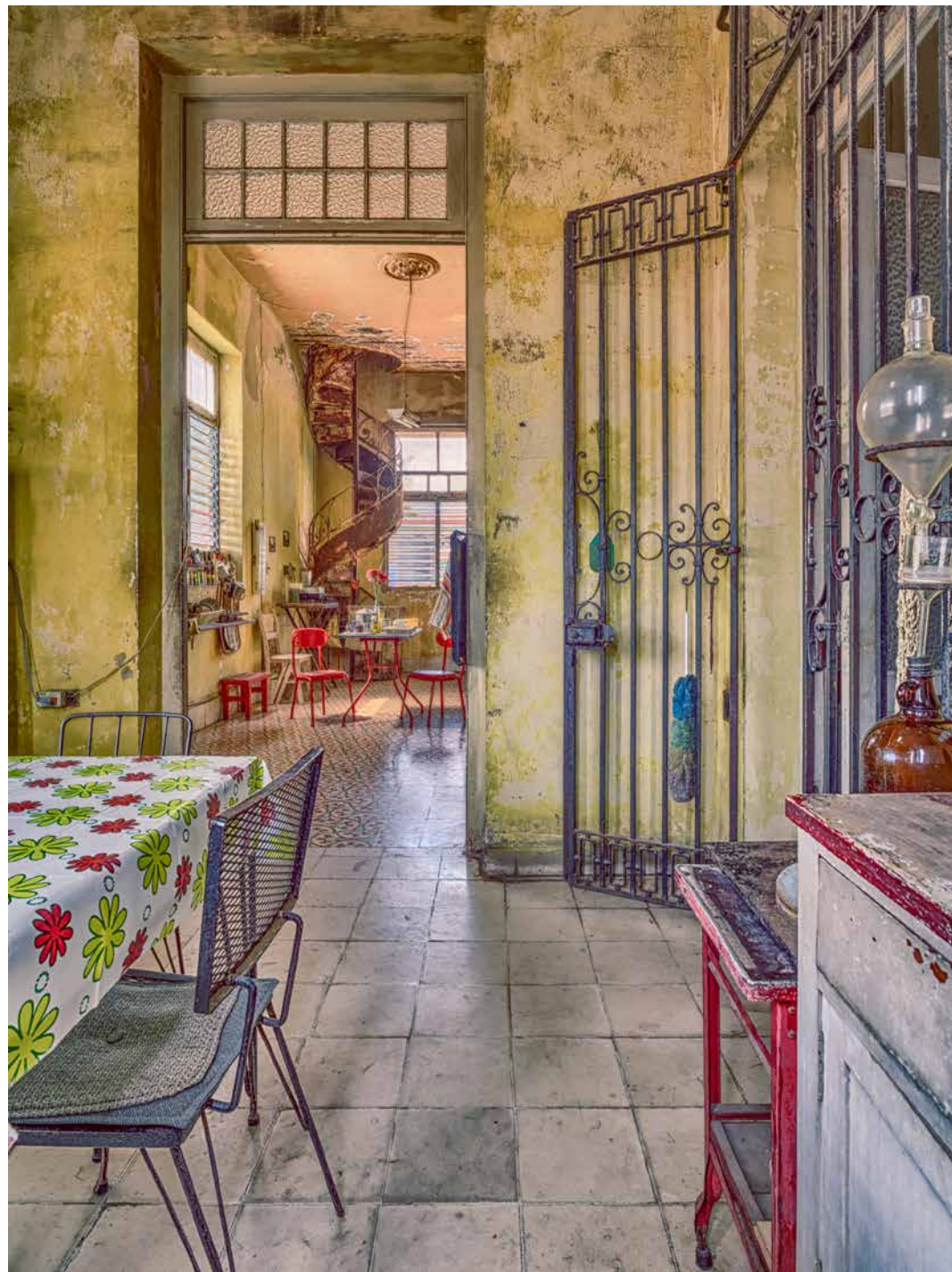

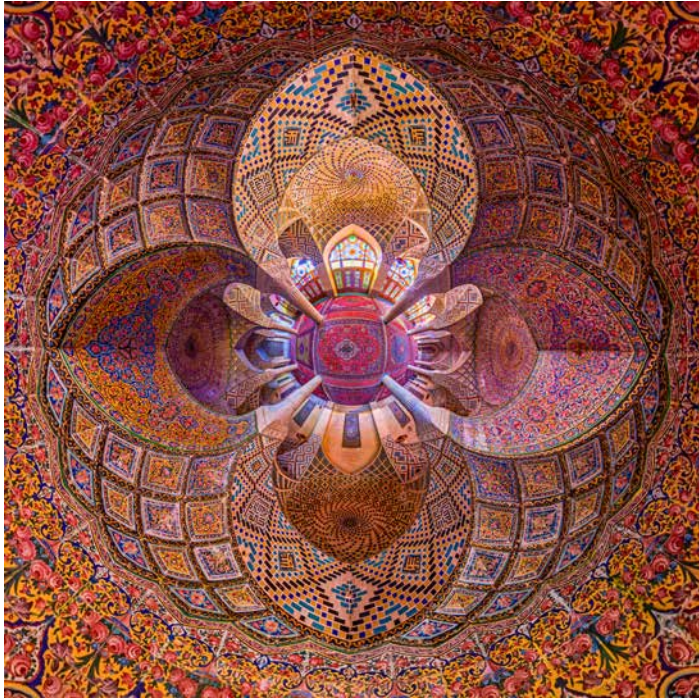
THE ORIENT | ENCHANTING ARCHITECTURE

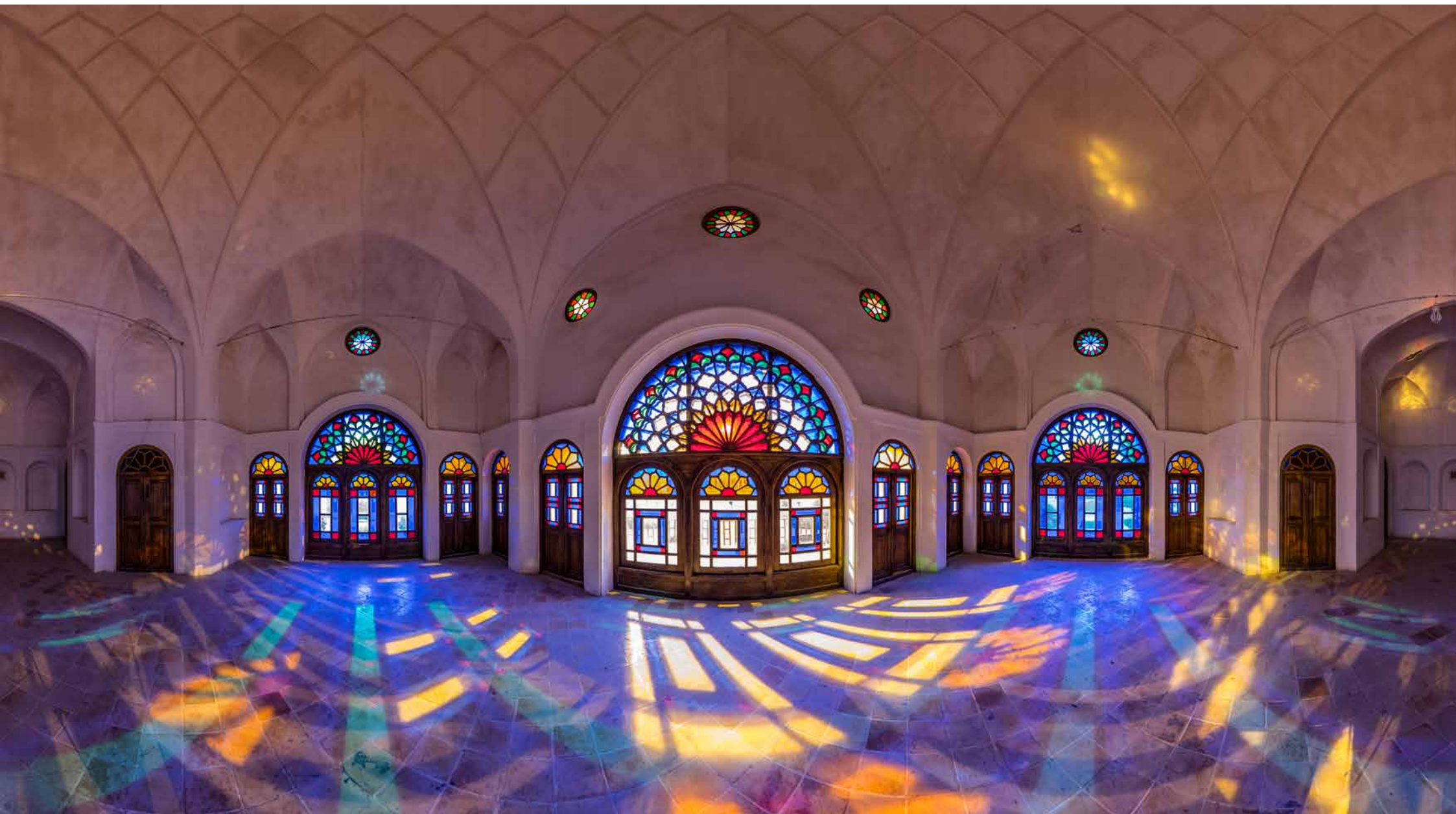














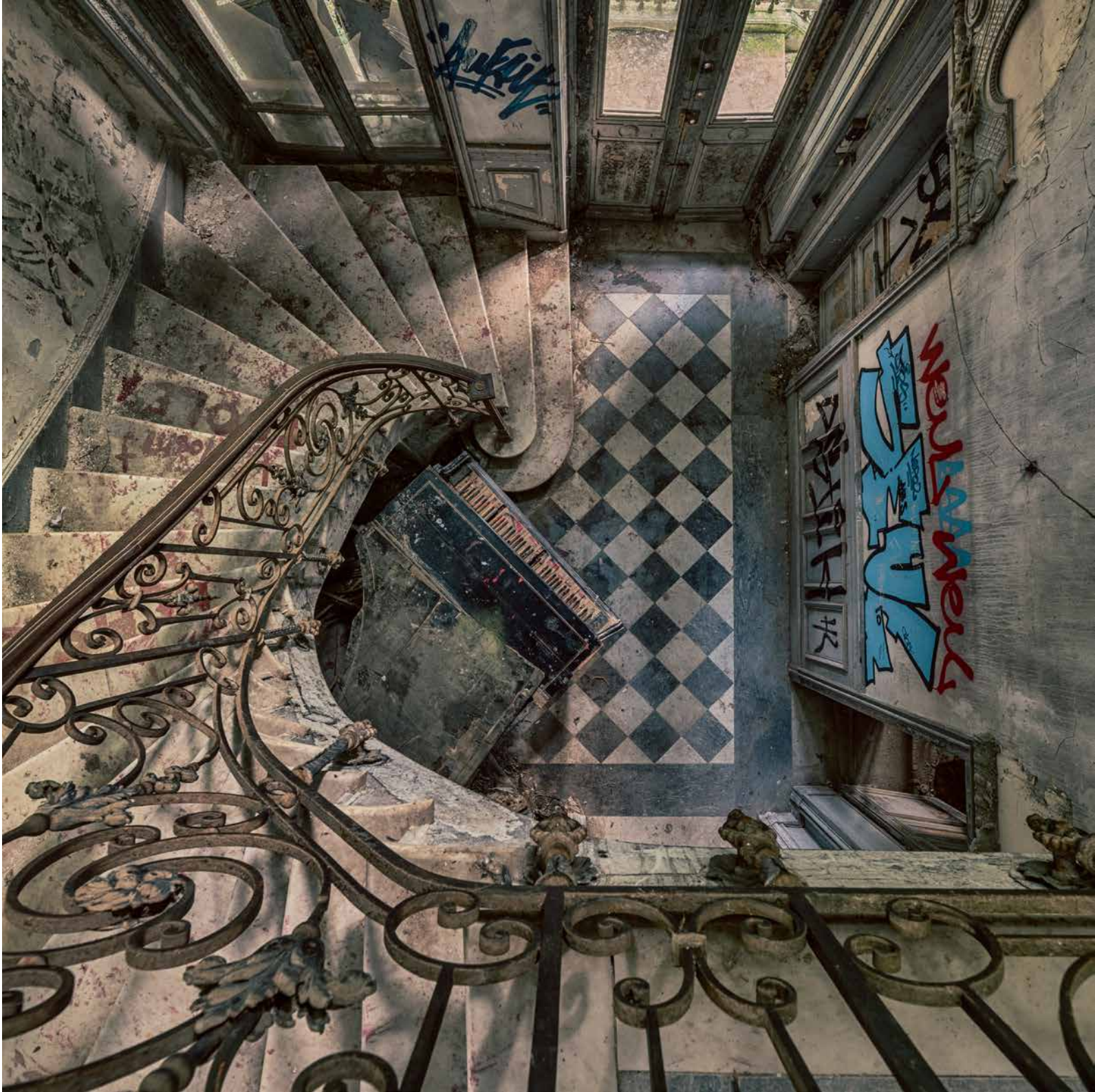
FASCINATION: FORGOTTEN PLACES

Is time lost if it is not preserved in memory or in a work of art?
Is a place magical because it has been forgotten and abandoned?
How morbid may beauty be?

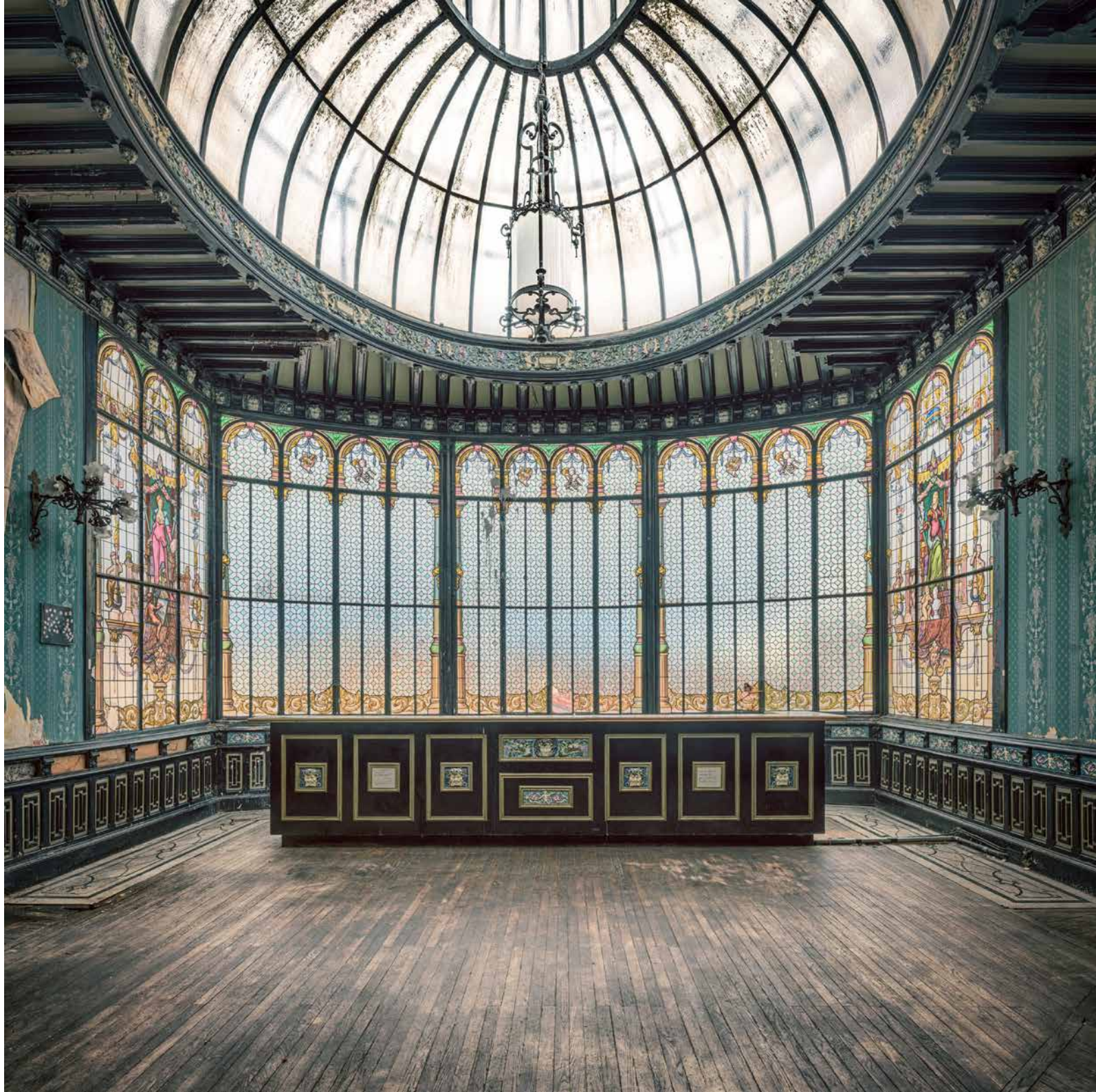
These are the kinds of questions that preoccupy the photographic artist Daniel Ricardo González. His spirit of discovery is directly transferred to his subjects, awakening in us as viewers a sense of searching and finding, of wonder and experience.

Daniel Ricardo González transforms himself from photographer into visual author by generating new pictorial motifs based on real locations, thereby further intensifying the mysterious magic of his “lost places.” Once González has managed to track down one of these – often closely guarded – sites, there is no holding back. The camera is merely an assistant, for only when all the other senses are activated does the photographer enter a state of flow, that blissful feeling of oneness with himself and the place.

This experience is documented solely by pressing the camera’s shutter. Only later, in his own image laboratory, does he deliberately develop individual motifs intended to touch us as viewers not only visually, but physically. The “lost place” works of the Ravensburg-based photographer are fascinating projection surfaces for our own desires, dreams, and memories – also because through them we sense a transcendent connection.

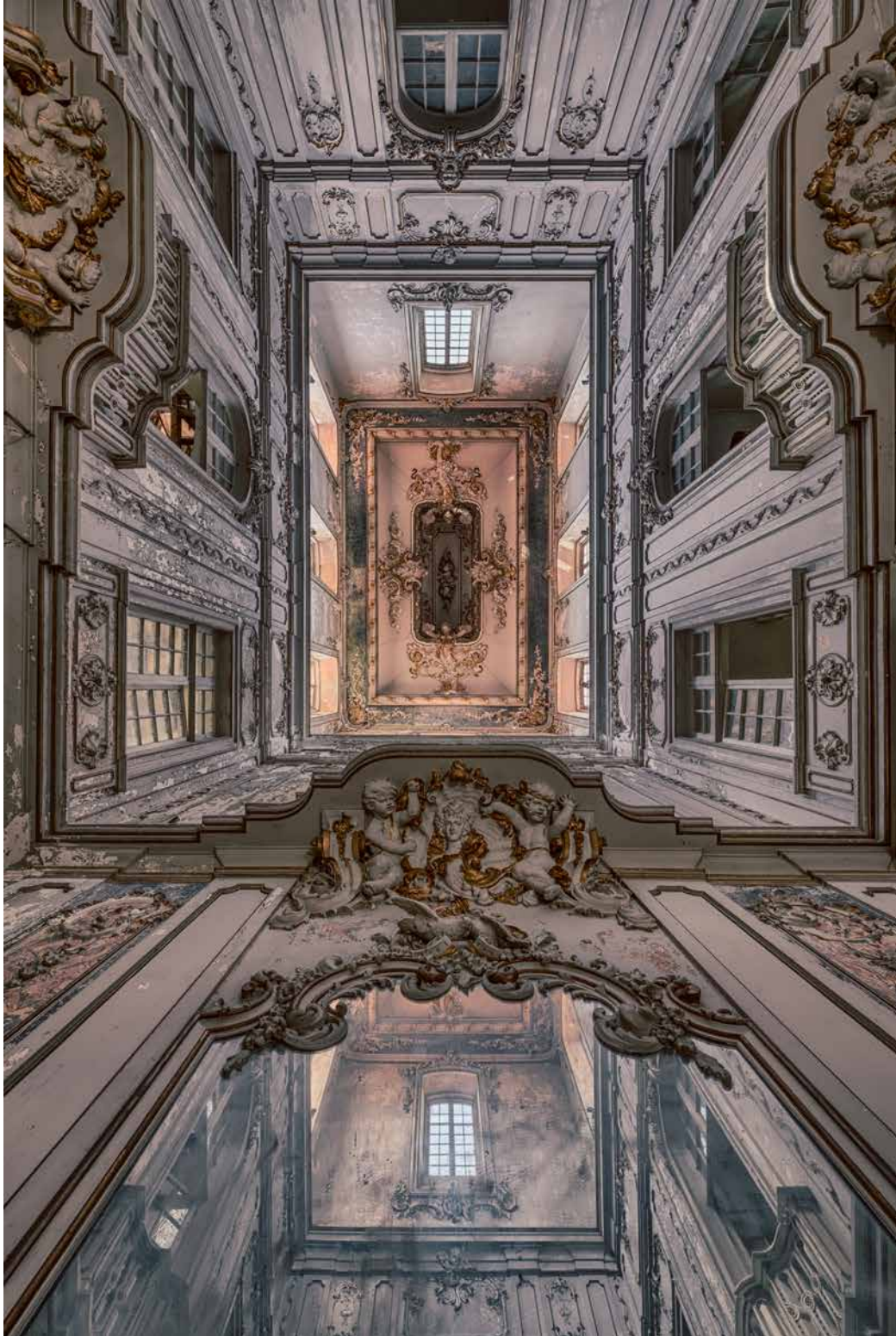




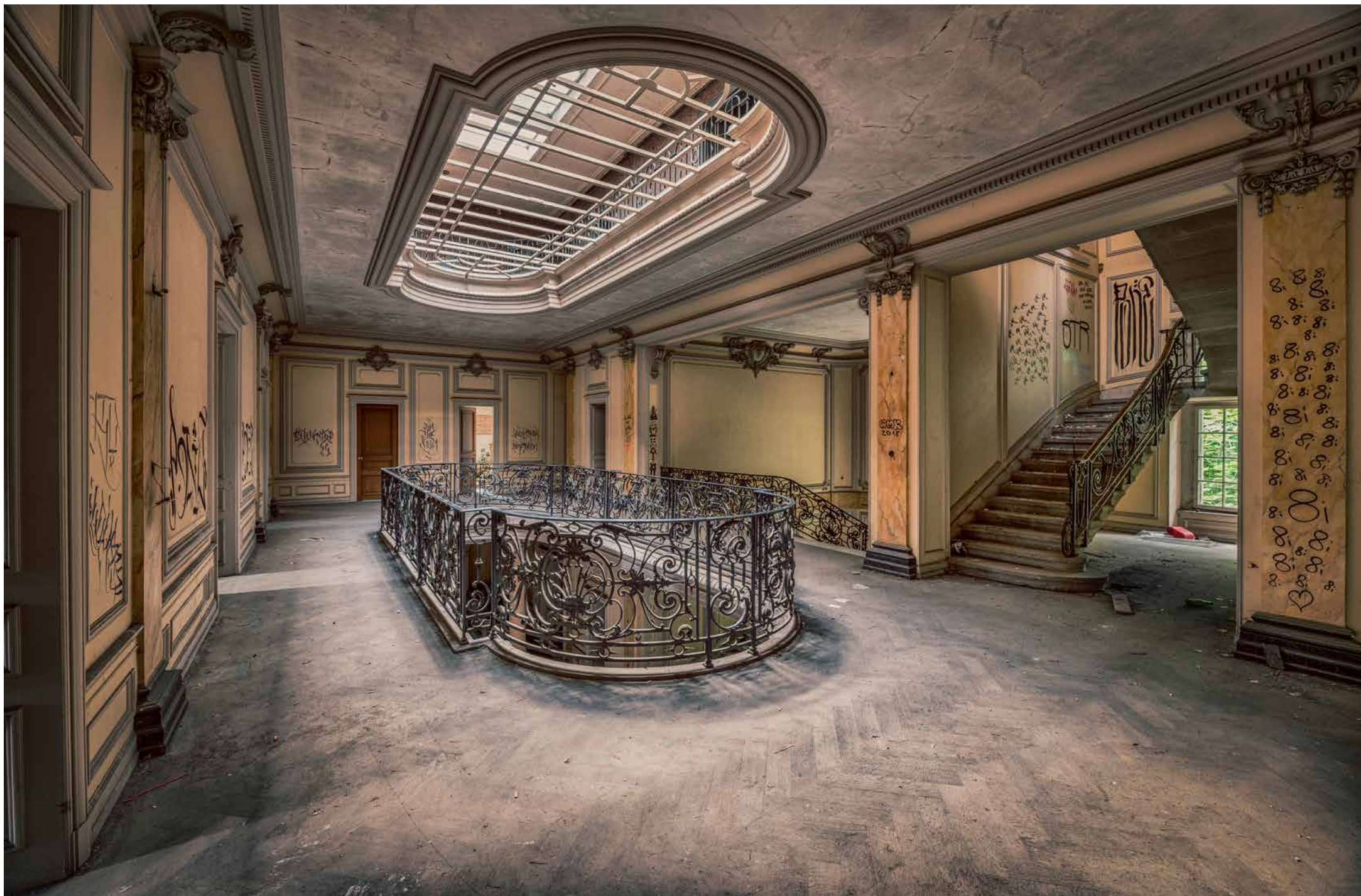

The Ravensburg-based son of a Spaniard and a half-French mother is a versatile artist, passionate photographer, and world traveler. On his journeys, he seeks not only extraordinary places but above all their quiet stories. With a keen sensitivity to light, space, and atmosphere, he approaches familiar as well as forgotten locations with an almost childlike curiosity, revealing the magic of what lies hidden. His guiding principle: “Beauty is everywhere.”

González understands photography as an artistic medium that leads the viewer into expanded visual spaces. His works resist a purely documentary reading and open up poetic levels in which perception and memory intertwine. Particularly in his architectural photography, a subtle tension emerges between past and present, touching a deep, often hidden longing within the viewer.

A central source of his inspiration is his faith in the wonderful Creator, from which he draws strength and inner peace. González’s works invite the viewer to pause, to lose perspective, and to immerse themselves in atmospheric visual worlds that reach far beyond the visible.
